### 【 General Information 】

Croatia is a country located on the Balkan Peninsula in southern Europe, with Zagreb as its capital. It gained independence from Yugoslavia in 1991. This country's area is 56,590 square kilometers, which is 15% of Japan. The official language is Croatian, but English, German, and Italian are also spoken by the people.

### 【 Ghibli's movie model city 】

Dubrovnik, Croatia is said to have been the inspiration for Majono Takkyubin, one of the Ghibli classics. Dubrovnik is famous for its cityscape unified by orange roofs. Majono Takkyubin depicts the main character, Kiki, flying over the city. The city is also said to be the model for "Kurenaino Buta."

### 【 Originated in Croatia 】

Croatia is the birthplace of the necktie. Its beginning is in the 17th century. It is said that this tradition began when women wrapped red scarves around men's necks and sent them off to pray for their safety. The French saw it and liked it, and it spread throughout Europe. Additionally, neckties are called "cravat" in European countries, and the word itself comes from the word "croat", which means "croatian".

### <izumo soba>

Izumo soba is a food culture that represents the Izumo region. It is characterized by a darker appearance than regular soba. It is said that soba spread to the Izumo region in the early Edo period when Matsudaira Naomasa brought craftsmen to the area.
