Traditional British food

Izumo Taisha Shrine

8 million gods are coming



At Izumo Taisha Shrine, October is the "Kamiaritsu". As a lodging facility for gods who gather from all over Japan, the doors of the "Jukusha" are opened only at this time of year. It was built in the 6th year of Bunka (1809). Made from rare fir wood.

Traditional food is "Zenzai" in Izumo!



As you know, Zenzai is famous food in Izumo. It is served when they held "Kamari festival" in October. Zenzai is the birthplace in Izumo. There are stores that sell Zenzai at Shinmon road.

Izumo Shrine Main Hall

The current main shrine was in 1744 and took three and a years to complete. At 24 meters in height, it is one of the largest shrine buildings in Japan.
